

DHA's affordable housing program admissions are based on an area median income (AMI), which is calculated according to your gross annual income (before taxes and benefits are deducted). DHA follows state and federal income limits to determine eligibility.

Here is a reference chart that has the most recent area median income (AMI) metrics for your reference.
